

STASH YOUR TRASH

Proper Solid Waste Management around homes and businesses is the most effective method of preventing bear nuisance problems!

BE BEAR AWARE!

Bears that are fed, intentionally or not, learn to associate food with people. These bears may cause extensive property damage and will be destroyed by euthanasia. You can help prevent this with responsible actions.

Incline Trash Ordinance 1 requires homeowners and property managers take steps to ensure trash is always contained. Violations are subject to fines.

How You Can Help:

Put garbage out the day of collection only (5 am or later). It is a violation to leave trash out for collection at any other time.

Keep Commercial Dumpsters / Bear Proof containers CLOSED & LOCKED at all times. Do not overload dumpsters. They must close and lock!

Invest in a Wildlife Resistant Garbage Can Enclosure (GCE). Installing a GCE is the best option- bears have been known to break into garages or buildings.

Wash trash containers and enclosures with disinfectant solution or ammonia, once a week to reduce odors.

Seasonal/Weekend Residents: For your convenience, the Incline Transfer Station (775-831-2971) located at Hwy. 28 and Sweetwater Road is open 7 days a week, from 8 am to 4 pm. You can dispose of 2 bags of trash or recyclable items, for free.
