

Please Continue to Stash Your Trash and Do Not Feed the Wildlife!

We have had some bear activity this summer within the District, but so far things have been much quieter compared to the last few years. This is due in part to more people taking positive steps to reduce wildlife access to food/trash in our community, and partly due to NDOW removing some problem bears over the past year. Thank you to all who have taken the issue of reducing animal access to food/trash sources seriously. Our community is making progress! Within the District, if you see trash being placed out too early, or unlocked/overfilled dumpsters, you can call the IVGID 24 hour Trash Hotline at 775-832-1221, and the situation will be investigated.

The impacts of feeding wildlife is another area we are trying to educate community members about. Waste Not has received several reports of residents feeding animals. Feeding wild animals is wrong for several reasons: 1) the animals become habituated to being provided food, 2) they become less fearful of humans, 3) feeding animals increases the risk to your own and your neighbors' safety, 4) property damage or injury can result, 5) the animal will be put down because it gets into trouble.

Director's Corner

Things have been changing rapidly in the area of solid waste management in our community; as we have increased community recycling and responded to changing wildlife issues. Washoe County just passed a new requirement for the entire county to reach a 35% recycling diversion rate within 5 years. The District has formed a new working group consisting of community members to look at the existing recycling programs offered in the community and what are the options to increase the recycling rate in our community. This advisory group will be working over the next six months and reports will be made to the Board of Trustees.
